COURSE CONTENT

The content of the course in Advanced Placement Spanish Language and Culture will reflect intellectual and casual interests shared by the students and teacher (the arts, history, current events, literature, culture, etc.). Materials will include recordings of narratives, music, films, newspapers, magazines, photographs and videos. The course will seek to develop language skills that are useful and can be applied to various activities and disciplines rather than to the mastery of any specific subject matter. Therefore, the specific areas of oral proficiency, composition, reading comprehension, and grammar that will be covered will be left to the discretion of the instructor as he/she discovers areas of weakness or needing special attention as evidenced by the oral and written journals and assignments submitted by the students as well as by other indicators.

The course will prepare the students to take the Advanced Placement Spanish Language Examination given in the spring. **(This test is strongly recommended for all students enrolled in the Spanish 5A/B AP Language and Culture course and the fee will be \$94).** The examination will consist of two sections that will test the four basic skill areas of listening, speaking, reading and writing. We will focus on 6 themes: *Global Challenges, Personal and Public Identities, Science and Technology, Beauty and Aesthetics, Contemporary Life, Families and Communities.*

It is expected that parents will constantly monitor their child's progress. Therefore, it is extremely important that both, students and parents, regularly monitor completion of assignments and grades in "Illuminate" –Samohi's electronic grade book—on the Internet. LATE WORK: Any work turned in late will receive 50% of the original value. It will only be accepted during the current grading period. After a progress report has been sent home, work for that previous grading period will no longer be accepted.
